Question of the Week

“If persistence is a characteristic of faith, how have I shown this characteristic in my prayer life and actions?”

If there is a tree directly in your path, you know for certain that you should walk around it. No faith is required to make that decision.

Faith, however, is required to believe that God made the tree.

Faith is not a product of sensory data or unassailable scientific proofs. It does not appear in front of us with the kind of certainty that stares us in the face, forcing us to accept its reality.

However, there is something certain about faith: it is a gift from God which he freely offers to everyone without reservation.

Less certain is what we do with that gift. Perhaps that is why persistence in prayer and action is necessary, even when the proof does not always stare us in the face.

Liturgical Ministries

Sacristans

Sacristans assist with the immediate preparation for Mass by preparing the bread and wine, lighting the candles and setting out the proper books and vessels. After Mass, sacristans return the vessels and books to their proper places. Sacristans usually serve between one and three times a month.

Ushers

Ushers help to maintain a prayerful atmosphere during Mass. Some of their responsibilities include: helping people find seats when the church is crowded, taking up the collection, helping with the communion procession and handing out bulletins. Ushers can serve once a week, once a month or whatever frequency they prefer.
