Rachel's Vineyard Post-Abortion Retreat October 28th through 30th

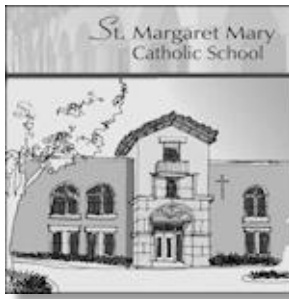
