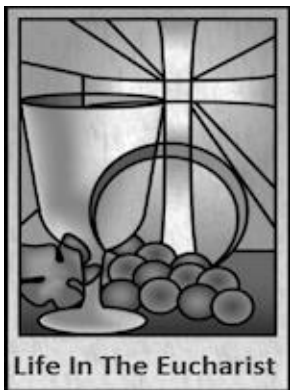
### **The Living Last Supper**

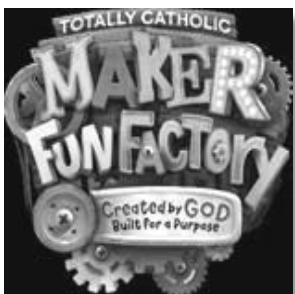
## Beloved

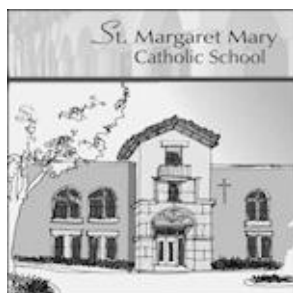


### **40 Days for Life**

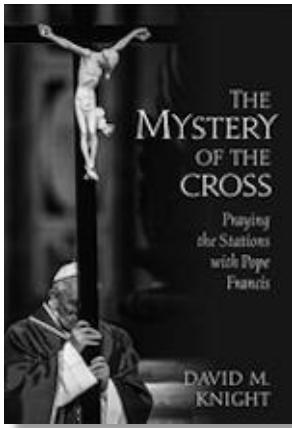


### **Holy Thursday Foot Washing**

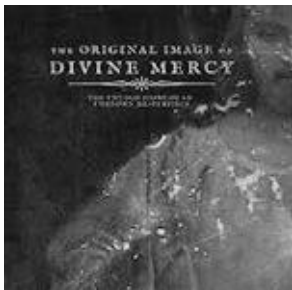


## **Lenten Movie “Last Days in the Desert”**
