

The Holy Seasons of Lent and Easter present a profound opportunity to deeply reflect on the mystery of our salvation as those Called, Gifted, and Sent. Recognizing that the Death and Resurrection of Christ form the axis around which Lent and Easter revolve, these seasons remind us that discipleship entails embracing self-emptying and total surrender (Phil 2:6-11), sacrifice, and a commitment to live for God's glory and a call to serve others. The Lenten period, serves a dual purpose. Beyond preparing us for the Easter festivities, it also prompts us to re-evaluate our relationship with God, beckoning us toward renewal and transformation.

The readings in Lent encourage our focus on the Eucharistic theme, *One with Christ:* Surrender, Trust, and Empowered to Serve.

Surrender is rooted in deep trust that God is good, loving, and has a greater plan for our lives, even when we don't fully understand it. As we journey in faith, we are called to entrust ourselves fully to God's unwavering love and faithfulness. This trust enables us to embrace the unknown, confident that God is always present, guiding us through life's challenges, even when the path ahead is unclear. During Lent, we are invited to "go deeper" with God, letting go of self-interest and surrendering to God's will as Jesus modeled for us during His 40 days of temptation in the wilderness. Through His Temptation, Passion, Crucifixion, Death, and Resurrection, Christ teaches us the acts of total surrender, trust in God, and selfless service to others.

As we journey through the 2025 Lenten Season that culminates in the Easter celebrations and extends to Pentecost, let us remember that our call to serve and bear witness to the world cannot be fully realized unless we are united with Christ. As Pilgrims of Hope in this Jubilee Year, and as those Called, Gifted, and Sent, may we be inspired to embrace the needs of others, to serve them with compassion and kindness, and to share the Good News of Jesus' Resurrection.

Encountering THE SEASON

Lent for the Family

First Sunday of Lent (C)

Deuteronomy 26:4-10 Romans 10:8-13 Luke 4:1-13

Dear Family:

Read the reflection about beginning the journey, and discuss the "Ponder and Pray" questions and prompts, thinking about how Our Lord is calling you to act. Then consider the challenges of the "Live It" section, have fun with the family activities, and dive into the *visio divina* prayer exercise.

The Journey Begins with Jesus and Mary

This Lent, we are invited to embark on a journey with Jesus and Mary as Jesus sets his face toward Jerusalem (see Luke 9:51). This path represents the final steps toward his sacrifice, a journey of divine love and mercy. Though the Gospels don't explicitly mention Mary's presence alongside Jesus, her deep love for her son suggests she would have remained close, witnessing his ministry and accompanying him in spirit.

Imagine walking with Mary as the crowds gather to hear Jesus. She stands quietly, her eyes fixed on her son, aware of the conversion happening in the hearts of the apostles, the Pharisees, and the sinners on the fringes. Mary, who knows Jesus better than anyone, notices things others miss—his gestures, his focus, and the way he loves each person before him. She tugs at your elbow, gently nodding toward Jesus, reminding you to fix your gaze upon him.

We cried to the LORD the God of our fathers, and the LORD heard our voice, and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression.

-Deuteronomy 26:7



As we walk with Mary this Lent, we learn from her unwavering trust in God's plan. Her maternal gaze helps us to see Jesus through her eyes, drawing us closer to him. Mary's radical availability to God, her complete surrender, and her compassionate heart challenge us to make ourselves available to God as well.

This Lent, ask yourself: Will I walk with Mary and Jesus? Will I allow her to guide me deeper into the mystery of God's love and mercy as I journey to the Cross?

Ponder and Pray

- As you imagine walking with Mary alongside Jesus on his journey to Jerusalem, what emotions do you feel? How do you relate to Mary's quiet trust during this time?
- Mary's trust in God's plan is unwavering. Do you struggle to surrender to God, and how might you follow Mary's example of availability and trust?
- As Mary points you to Jesus, what distractions in your life prevent you from fully focusing on him this Lent?

Live It

This week, walk spiritually with Jesus and Mary. In prayer or quiet reflection, ask Mary to help you see Jesus through her eyes—paying attention to his presence in your life. As you practice your Lenten sacrifices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, reflect on how you can make yourself more available to God as Mary did. Daily, pray: "Mary, help me walk with Jesus today."

Visio Divina

Spend time reflecting on the image of Mary and the Child Jesus. Jesus appears to be making an offering to the Father, and Mary is gently watching over him.



FL Bishops Advocate Against Scheduled Execution

Acknowledging the immeasurable suffering endured by victims Betty Dick & Toni Neuner and their family, The Catholic Bishops of Florida sent a letter to implore the Governor to stay the execution of their killer on March 20. Factors they share include that:

- The dignity and unalienable rights of every human are not annihilated by even gravely evil acts. It is better for the people of Florida to punish severely without themselves acting to kill.
- •Life imprisonment without parole is a severe punishment which also serves to protect society.
- •Life imprisonment has the added value of permitting repentance and conversion

Our governors encourage us to pray for the family of these victims and all victims of violent crimes, for an end to the death penalty, for Edward James and all those on death row, and for Governor DeSantis, as he considers proceeding with this execution. They also request that we call or write to advocate against this execution, Visit flaccb.org/death-penalty for information and a sample letter.


